A veteran community builder and proven business leader, for the past four years Greg served in a variety of leadership roles at Second Harvest Heartland, including interim CEO, board chair and member of the executive Capital Campaign Committee.

Before turning his heart and skills to the nonprofit sector, Greg spent 33 years in the banking industry in top leadership positions, the majority of that time at Bremer Bank where he served as Midwest Group President with responsibility for over 70 locations in Minnesota, Wisconsin and North Dakota.

During his tenure as CEO of Bremer Bank in Willmar, Greg ignited and led community initiatives in the areas of economic sustainability, cultural competency, education, recreation and transportation. He served as a leader in the Willmar Vision 2020 Steering Committee, Ridgewater College Foundation Board, Willmar Area Community Foundation, Citizens for Success, African Development Center, YMCA Capital Campaign Cabinet and the Willmar Area Development Corporation. Volunteers ignite the power of community


